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Safety On The Beach

Foreign Police Officers Join In Providing Swimmer Safety



The Croatian interior ministry continues this year its special activities aimed at improving safety for tourists at beaches along the length of the Adriatic seaboard. And just like last year, this year Croatian police officers will be joined by their colleagues from other European countries in maintaining safety. After the excellent results of last year's cooperation with their Hungarian colleagues, whose joint safety improvement project on Croatian beaches won top marks, cooperation has this year been established with police officers from six European countries – Hungary, France, the Czech Republic, Austria, Slovakia and the German Federal State of Bavaria. The arrival of four police officers is expected from each of the countries, to be deployed in areas with the highest concentrations of tourists from their respective countries. So it is to be expected that the Austrian police officers will make their way to Opatija, while the other European police officers will head out to areas across all of Dalmatia. Their roles will be above all that of interpreters, given that the Croatian legislative framework does not give them wide authorities, but that will be enough for tourists from their countries to feel safer.

Besides on beaches, the European colleagues will join their Croatian colleagues in daily tours of highways and the coastal area in the recently established mobile units.

The project is the only one of its kind in Europe, pooling the resources of the Ministry of the Interior, the Croatian National Tourism Board and the Ministry of the Sea, Tourism, Transport and Development. And it is precisely because of its originality that the project has already garnered the praise of police officers from other European countries, so that within the year we can also expect to see foreign police officers "cruising" along Spanish beaches, providing an additional sense of safety for tourists from their respective countries on vacation there.

Large-Scale Investment In Marina Improvement



After last years big moves in renovating and improving Istrian marinas, investments in the area continue this year with over 750,000 euros invested by the start of May in ACI (Adriatic Croatia International Club) marinas. The invested funds saw the reconstruction and attentive redesign of all sanitary facilities at the marina in Umag, the marina in Rovinj has been expanded for eight new floating piers, extensive locksmith's work has been carried out at one of the pontoons at the marina in Pula, and technical documentation has been prepared for the construction of a breakwater at the marina in Pomer, to be completed in one of the coming phases of the renovation of ACI facilities.


There are, of course, investments being made into the other marinas on the Adriatic seaboard. Extensive works on the replacement of all pontoons are being completed at the marinas in the city of Rab on the Kvarner area island of the same name, at Skradin in Šibenik-Knin County and at Palmizana on the island of Hvar in southern Croatia.

All of the sanitary facilities at the marina in Cres have been given a facelift, while at Jezera on the island of Murter work is ongoing on all of the piers in need of repair.

The ACI Company is the leading nautical tourism company in Croatia boasting a chain of 21 marinas. They are strung along the length of the coastline, from Umag in the north to Dubrovnik in the deep south of Croatia and link the key tourist destinations on the Croatian Adriatic. 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Rovinj's Batana House

Museum Wins The Hearts Of Both Jury And Experts



Although it did not win the European Museum of the Year Award for 2007, the Batana House Eco Museum in Rovinj did win the hearts of many of the jury members, even that of Belgian Queen Fabiola who, at the awards ceremony, with evident delight praised the leaders of this attractive Rovinj museum.

The EMYA 2007 award was marked by an exceptionally strong field of competitors. As many as 61 museums were nominated, three of which from Croatia, with the Batana House making the final round of voting and counted among the 25 best museum projects to emerge over the past two years in all of Europe. Proclaimed as the best European museum of 2007 was the Museum of Emigration from the German town of Bremerhaven.


The Batana House is a special kind of museum that presents an integral interpretation of the identity of the local community of the Rovinj area. The museum is dedicated to the batana fishing boat – the original kind of fishing launch that has been manufactured in Rovinj for many years.

The museum's entire story does not, however, revolve just around the boats – there is a cornucopia of other tales closely related to the overall heritage of Rovinj, from its specialities, songs, folk traditions, even the unique dialect known now only by the older inhabitants of the town.

Rovinj is, however, not known only for the Batana House. The artistic and cultural soul of this Istrian town is evident at practically every step – starting from the best known of Rovinj's symbols – the magnificent church of St. Euphemia. Here too is, of course, the old, Renaissance, part of town whose picturesque small streets are home to many small galleries on account of which we might easily call this a town of artists.

One of the best known is, of course, Grisija Street – a winding, stone paved, street that has been since 1967 for one day every year converted into a real open-air treasure trove of artistry. As it will be again this year when, on the second Sunday in August, the street will host a wide array of art work, creating a symbiosis with the surroundings.

Large-Scale Investments Into Hotel Capacities



At least five hotel resorts are to be completely revamped in the Kvarner area by the year's end. According to the available data these are investments worth a little under 130 million euros, earmarked for the most part for the renovation, development and construction of new, predominantly high-quality, tourism capacities.

Mentioned among the largest of the investments as the Novi Vinodolski-based Novi resorts & Hotels where the word is another high category five-star hotel is to be built. As announced, the hotel would, along with the standard high quality offer to guests, also attract them with its lavish wellness centre and Children's Town.

Also ongoing is the renovation of the hotel Miramare in Crikvenica where the renovation of an attractive Secession building, a part of the company's holdings, has been announced. A detailed reconstruction of the building will be followed by the development of a new four-star standard hotel. The new hotel will feature 140 new rooms, a conference centre and a number of other facilities.

Investments are also being made into the Liburnia Riviera Hotel Company whose top management has announced the complete renovation of the Villa Ambassador, situated right next to the five-star Hotel Ambassador.

Prominent among the larger investments is the construction of a new apart-hotel in the town of Malinska on the island of Krk where guests will have at their disposal some 50 apartments and a smaller wellness and congress centre.

The construction of a new small family hotel, the Arbiana, has been announced on the island of Rab.

New Tourist Products On The Upswing



Although up to now on the margins of tourism development, Požega-Slavonia County, situated in eastern Croatian (western Slavonia), has always been an area with numerous and attractive elements, now available to a growing number of tourists. One thing is for sure – the county leadership and the many people there who have in tourism recognised the best route to their own promotion and development, await tourists with anticipation, with the aim of providing them with a showcase of the traditional customs and culture of Slavonia were it actually happens.

And so as many as twenty different groups from across the county have applied for Croatian National Tourism Board and Ministry of the Sea, Tourism, Transportation and Development assistance programs with the aim of better developing newly conceived tourism programs. Admittedly, not all of these programs will be realised this year, but tourists making their way to the town of Požega and its rich wine growing surroundings will certainly have plenty to enjoy.

June will showcase a traditional Požega event – the Ivanjski krijes (Midsummer Day bonfire) – an event that spotlights the tradition of lighting bonfires on the surrounding hills and which is accompanied by numerous entertainment programs. That will be followed by a real culinary treat, the Kulenijada (featuring the Slavonian speciality dry-cured cold cut, the kulen), and the settlement of Velika near Požega will play host to a traditional International Folklore Review. The richly entertaining Lipanj u Lipiku (June in Lipik) will be organised in the town of Lipik, located in the west of the country, from the middle to the end of June.

There will be plenty of attractions in the other parts of the county as well, with preparations under way for the Požega Summer of Culture, the Vineyard Blooming in Kutjevo, an Equestrian Tournament, the Zlatne žice Slavonije (Golden Strings of Slavonia) tambouritzta event, the Fišijada (a fish paprika stew cook-off) and many other traditional Slavonian festivals.

A Facelift For The Ribnjak Excursion Grounds



Croatians, their guests and tourists passing through the vicinity of the city of Virovitica, located right on the border with Hungary, from now on have a new tourist destination to visit – an excursion area at the well-known Virovitica Ribnjak (fishpond).

With the end of the first phase of a complete overhaul of the fishpond, the excursion grounds has opened its doors to visitors in early May. Phase one of the development of the excursion grounds saw a thorough clean up of the entire area, which has opened the vista of the small lake, rich in fish. There has been a complete re-landscaping, with 26 new tables and benches installed with a 180-guest capacity, the sanitary facilities have been revamped, as has the parking area and a playground for children with swings and see-saws.

The entire area has been fenced-off, meaning that automobiles no longer have access to the natural setting.

The second phase of the overhaul will see barbeque areas set up, a boat pier, a sand box for the kids and a beach volleyball court, with a new five-a-side soccer field and bowling area to be completed by the year's end.

Virovitica is a town with a long history, something you can see to this day on its streets. It is situated at the crossing of the chief traffic routes that link Croatia to Hungary, where the picturesque region of Bilogora and the Slavonian flatlands – the fertile Pannonia plains – meet. The town offers many opportunities for entertainment, and its environs an opportunity to enjoy a practically pristine nature dominated by wine growing hills and the wide expanses of the Slavonian and Podravina region flatlands.

8th Festival Of Dance And Non-Verbal Theatre



The small Istrian town of Svetvinčenat, situated not far from the city of Pula, will from the 20th to 25th of July play host to the attractive Festival of Dance and Non-Verbal Theatre, now in its eighth consecutive year.

This is one of the few events of its kind in Croatia, showcasing a wide range of happenings – from dance shows and performances, street theatre and circus and even visual arts installations and dance workshops.

The first Festival of Dance and Non-Verbal Theatre was held in Svetvinčenat in July of 2000, and was immediately recognised as a welcome cultural event both in Istra and in all of Croatia.

The festival is all the more attractive on account of it being staged in, for these kinds of events, somewhat unusual locations, given that Svetvinčenat lacks an adequate “festival” infrastructure. But it has precisely on this account now won over numerous admirers and devotees, being an event that has already made a name for itself and that, among other things, spotlights the latest dance productions.

The goal of the festival has remained unchanged for years now – to showcase the latest dance productions of Croatian and international contemporary dance ensembles. This year too will bill the top performing artists from many countries in Europe and around the world.

The festival program will take place inside Castle Grimani, a stunning Renaissance structure with a special atmosphere and charm, and on the square in front of the castle, which certainly gives this festival a special something.

The chief event organiser is the Zagreb Dance Ensemble, whose staff can also help out when it comes to finding accommodations for the event. There is, namely, no hotel in Svetvinčenat, and both visitors and performers can find lodgings at the homes of the people of Svetvinčenat who can hardly wait for the festival's five days, when the streets and squares of this sleepy town will awake once more and revive the former splendour and liveliness of this Renaissance town.

Libertas Film Festival



Dubrovnik will from June 29th to July 4th play host to the third consecutive Libertas Film Festival – an international festival of independent production films.

The festival's seven days will see screenings of a large number of feature-length, documentary and short films featuring, and as has been to case to date, numerous renowned local and foreign authors.

And while the festival program has not yet been worked out in all of its details, it can be assumed that visitors will be able to enjoy excellent films and a number of surprises.

Hollywood stars Woody Harrelson and Owen Wilson showed up at the festival last year and guests also had an opportunity to meet well-known Croatian actors.

The festival is a competitive event with an international jury conferring the Dubravka Award for best works in all three categories – feature length films, documentaries and short films. As of last year the festival also confers the Master Award for special contributions to the film industry.

The festival program will take place in several Dubrovnik locations – at the well-known Fort Revelin, the Marin Držić Municipal Theatre, the Sloboda movie theatre and at the Jadran summer movie theatre.

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Island of Lopud

An Out Of The Ordinary Art Project



The island of Lopud, not far from the city of Dubrovnik, will on June 20th be the scene of the presentation of an out of the ordinary art project – the Nomad's Pavilion - Your Black Horizon, by well-known artist of Danish and Icelandic roots, Olafur Eliasson, and London-based architect David Adjaye.

This unique installation of light organised by the Thyssen-Bornemisza Art Contemporary (T-B A21) international art foundation was formally presented with great acclaim among critics and the general public in June of 2005 as a part of the official program of the 51st Venice Biennale of Visual Arts and once again at the 10th Venice Biennale of Architecture in 2006. The pavilion melds art and architecture into one, both metaphorically in the actual expert dialogue of the creators and physically in the way the simple wooden construct forms a "frame" to the light installation. Its special quality lies in its adaptability to the individual locations in the environment where it is placed. Artist Olafur Eliasson will adapt the Pavilion's interior light installation to the light conditions present on Lopud for the showing there, so that it can truly be said that it will be again an original work of art, dedicated in this case, to Lopud. The aim of the Pavilion is not, however, to showcase this work of art, as it is in fact part of a greater idea of creating a proactive network of exhibition areas for contemporary art, based on installations of temporary, "travelling" so to speak, museum in smaller, less accessible places.

As a part of the presentation of the Nomad Pavilion – Your Black Horizon project, Dubrovnik will on June 20th host an international symposium entitled Patronage Over Space with public presentations and debates featuring many of today's most recognised activists from the art, architecture and education scenes.

On account of the artistic value and attractiveness of the project and because of the fact that the Croatian island of Lopud is, after Venice, the second location in the world to host it, several prestigious media houses have announced they will be in Dubrovnik for the event (Le Monde, Beaux Arts (France); Vanity Fair (Italy); Conde Nast Traveller, Financial Times, Icon Magazine, Monocle Magazine (Great Britain); Architectural Digest, Frankfurter Allgemeine Zeitung (Germany); Disegno (Spain)) which will certainly contribute to the promotion of the city of Dubrovnik and its environs as an attractive destination for both tourism and culture.

The Nomad Pavilion on the island of Lopud will be open through to October 31st of 2007.

The IQ Symbol For Added Quality



The Istrian Quality IQ symbol, a designation to be sported by apartments that meet stipulated additional standards in the northern Adriatic tourist region of Istra, is to be conferred as a part of the Domus Bonus Apartments project. The project was launched by the Istra County Tourist Board in collaboration with local tourist boards and the Istrian Development Agency. 141 apartments have been awarded the IQ symbol so far with guarantees tourists that all of the stipulated standards have been met, above the average for this kind of accommodation. This number is expected to grow by another hundred in the coming year with the mid-term goal being of securing 500 apartments included in the program.

An apartment bearing the Istrian Quality IQ symbol must offer guest reception services 24 hours a day, have a separate entrance, air conditioning, a landscaped surroundings, standardised quality of accommodation, household appliances, bed linen, dishware and more. Since as much as a quarter of the overall accommodations in Istra are offered as private accommodations, this spotlighting of those who offer a higher standard of services is a valuable guide for tourists. The IQ symbol on houses and apartments is, namely, a proof of true quality that will be regularly monitored, with the IQ symbol becoming the most recognisable Istrian brand in product and service quality.

The first product to bear the IQ Istrian Quality symbol in the products segment is the famed Istrian Malvasia wine, and it is logical that this branding, when it comes to services, starts with tourism, without a doubt to most impressive Istrian and Croatian trademark.

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Rijeka

A Double-Decker Tour Of The Town



Tourists in Rijeka from the start of June can tour the town and the nearby very attractive Opatija on a new double-decker bus.

This attractive tourist bus, with an open-air top deck can hold eighty people and, in case of rain, has a retractable canopy over the top deck. Tourists can hear about the city attractions in ten languages. The bus, which leaves on its tour every day at 9am, 1pm and 5pm has earphones installed through which tourists can select the language of their choice.


Besides for tours of the city, the bus will also be used for organised group excursions of for example children and students, for which the content of the recording will be adapted.

This project, for which the credit goes to the municipal leadership and the city's Tourist Board, has given Rijeka yet another recognisable tourist product following the model of many other cities. The bus, thanks to a local artist, has a recognisable appearance as it has been painted over in Rijeka motifs. These same images adorn the bus stops, promotional materials and the uniforms worn by the guides and bus drivers.

The bus will travel on the Opatija – Rijeka route with each tour lasting about three hours during which tourists will have an opportunity to get to know the key points of interest in both towns.

Tickets to ride this special double-decker will be on sale at the Rijeka Tourist Information Centre and on the bus itself.

In Rijeka tourists can also make use of the Rijeka Card to get a number of discounts at museums, galleries, shops and restaurants, and free public transport for a 48-hour period.

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
